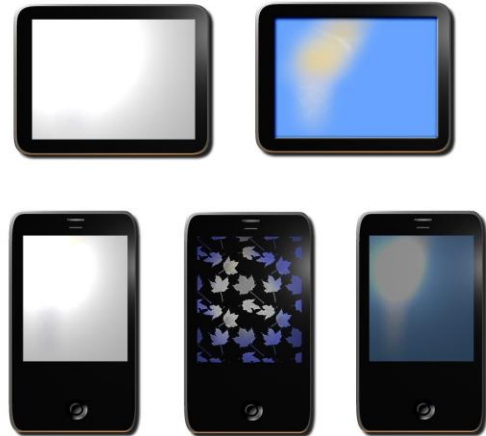

Some of the topics discussed will be electronic books, screen readers, speech recognition software, word prediction software and more. He will also discuss the strengths and weaknesses of a variety of different computerized devices including Windows computers, Mac computers, iPads, Chromebooks, and Android tablets.
